## 1. BONFIRE NIGHT

In the UK, Bonfire Night (also known as Guy Fawkes Night) is a special day in honour of a historic event. It's celebrated on 5th November and the sky at night is filled with colour.


The history:
In 1605 English Catholics were really angry because King James I wasn't treating them well. In November 1605 a few men had a plan to blow up the Houses of Parliament in London. An explosion was planned for 5 November (on that day the king was due to open Parliament). The leader of the group was called Guy Fawkes and the plan was known as the 'Gunpowder Plot'. The group put 36 barrels of gunpowder in the Houses of Parliament and waited for the king to arrive. However, the plan didn't succeed. The gunpowder was found by the police and all the men who were involved in the plot got caught. King James ordered the people of England to have a bonfire night on the night of 5 November in order to celebrate his survival.


Bonfires and fireworks.
On 5 November all over Britain there are firework displays and bonfires with models of Guy Fawkes, which are burned on the fire. The Guy is made of old clothes which are filled with newspapers. The fireworks are a reminder of the gunpowder which was hidden in the cellar of Parliament.

## Food for Bonfire Night.

November is often a cold month in England, so on Bonfire Night people wear scarves, gloves and hats. They need some warm food to keep them hot too. Typical Bonfire Night food is hot baked potatoes filled with butter and cheese. There are also marshmallows and toffee apples. In the north of England people eat special type of cake called parkin.

4. Thanksgiving Day

For sure you have heard about "The Thanksgiving Day". But do you know what it exactly is? Where and how is it celebrated? In this article I will try to give you answers for these questions.

The Thanksgiving Day is a national day in America. Its history comes back to year 1620. In this time first European villagers came to America to make a colony. They settled in New England. The colony was named Plymouth. After one year of living there, they organized huge feast in thanks for a bountiful harvest. Native Americans took part in the celebrations. This day became the symbol of unity, brotherhood and gratitude to God for gifts and protection.


Nowadays, in the fourth Thursday of November Americans celebrate The Thanksgiving Day. A tradition is to eat festive dinner with family. In the table there must be a turkey and other traditional meals and drinks such as: pecan pie (cake made of pumpkin and nuts), mashed potatoes or apple cider. After the feast there comes wishbone. It's a turkey's bone which is connected with another tradition. Two people each grab a side and break the bone apart while making a wish. Every year there is also a parade on the New York streets, called Macy's Thanksgiving Day Parade, where we can see balloons, artists and other attractions.
